

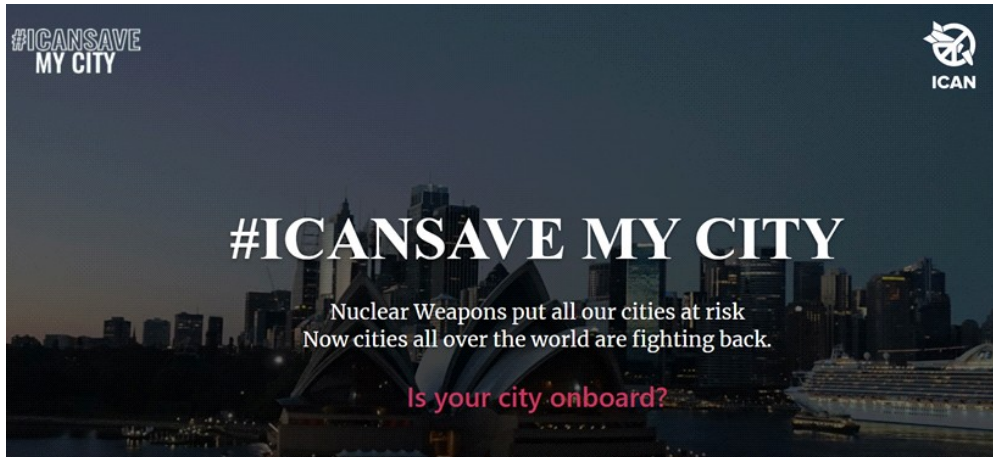

Nuclear Ban Communities

In July 2017, the UN adopted the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW), which forbids testing, building, funding and threatening to use them. Cities are the main targets, and now all over the world they are taking action to push their national governments to join the Treaty.

West Midlands CND is part of this movement to make UK towns and cities Nuclear Ban Communities. Working with your local politicians, your town or city council could soon join others who are already working towards a nuclear free world. Manchester, Leeds, Oxford and Norwich Councils have already passed resolutions supporting the TPNW and are calling on the UK Government to sign it – let's get the West Midlands signed up too.

This Pledge represents a commitment by Councillors to promote the United Nations Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons (TPNW) within their elected chamber. Resolutions supporting the TPNW have been passed at all levels of local government; from town councils, such as Hebden Royd (West Yorkshire); through unitary authorities, such as East Ayrshire; to city councils, such as Manchester and Edinburgh.
