War In Ukraine/NATO

- [Reuters looks](#) at EU sanctions on Russia and notes that **trade is still flowing between Moscow and the bloc - including in the nuclear industry.**
- [Opinion piece](#) for Al Jazeera likening **Putin's invasion of Ukraine to George Bush's invasion of Iraq.**
- [Declassified UK](#): 'Significant portion' of £4.8 billion UK lethal aid for Ukraine will remain secret. Meanwhile, earlier this month CAAT compiled a [list](#) of UK arms being shipped to Ukraine.
- Fred Kaplan [writes](#) for Slate on the announcement that **Russia will station nuclear weapons in Belarus.**
- The UN's nuclear watchdog chief [said](#) fighting near the Zaporizhzhia nuclear plant is 'intensifying' and that a nuclear accident there would spare no one. Rafael Grossi made the comments during a trip to the plant - where the IAEA have a permanent monitoring team.

Nuclear Weapons

- [A report](#) from Norwegian People's Aid found that **the number of useable nuclear warheads increased by 130 in 2022.**

Space

- Virgin Obit has [extended](#) its **unpaid furlough for workers**, as the company scrambles to find financial backers. The company has been teetering on the verge of bankruptcy after a failed rocket launch in January.
- The MoD has [ordered](#) a study on the possibility of building a deep-space radar site in Pembrokeshire, Wales. The proposal is part of United States Space Force (USSF)-led plans to develop a worldwide network of sensors called the Deep Space Advanced Radar Concept (DARC) to track active satellites some 22,000 miles above the Earth.

Trident

- [From The Times](#): A Royal Navy inquiry into reports of misogyny onboard its nuclear submarines has been thrown into dissarray, after the main whistleblower withdrew her support from the probe. Sophie Brook said the Navy was trying to "scapegoat" one senior officer in order to protect the reputation of the wider submarine service.

UK Nuclear Energy

- The Highlands Against Nuclear Power (HANP) group [said](#) it will strengthen its links with campaigners across Britain and Ireland to

oppose plans to build new nuclear power stations on the green freeport in the Moray Firth.

- Divers have [entered](#) the nuclear fuel storage pond at Sellafield for the first time in 65 years.
- The government has [announced](#) that its Great British Nuclear quango will be based around the Greater Manchester Area with competitions to build small modular reactors expected to be announced in the Autumn.
- [Great British Nuclear](#) will be headed by Magnox CEO Gwen Parry-Jones.
