Coventry Hiroshima Remembrance is on Sunday 6th august 2023 at 2pm in the nave of Coventry Cathedral and Coventry chapel of unity. All welcome. We are honoured with the presence of our Lord Mayor Councillor Jaswant Singh Birdi and Mr Yasuyuki Okazaki, Minister, Public Diplomacy of the Embassy of Japan and Coventry elected Councillors. Everybody from Coventry and beyond is welcome. 2023 is the 78th anniversary.

The two nuclear bombs of 1945, are the only ever use of Nuclear-Weapons. 266,400 died instantly. Many people died later of radiation poisoning. The Hibakusha – the explosions affected people -526,000 Hibakusha have died in Hiroshima and Nagasaki since 1945. The remembrance includes messages of greeting from our Lord Mayor of Coventry to the Mayor and people of Hiroshima and from to Mayor of Hiroshima to the Lord Mayor of Coventry and the people of Coventry; the story of Sadako, the making of cranes of Peace in origami, and finally the reading of Coventry Cathedral's Litany of Reconsiliation. Greetings will be by Coventry Young ambassadors. Coventry continues to build links with Hiroshima. In 2021 Coventry City Council sent a certificate of continuing friendship to the Hiroshima City Council. Coventry Cathedral's fellowship of reconciliation awarded a prestigious Coventry Cross of Nails to the people of Hiroshima recognising their contribution to world efforts for peace and reconciliation. The ambassador of Japan to the United Kingdom

commended the efforts of the Peace Committee with a certificate "of the spirit of profound gratitude" for everything that the committee had done.


