Hiroshima Lantern Floating Friday 9th August 2024



We had a wonderful sunlit evening and were blessed to have 40 people gather together round the peace pole to hear the messages from the Mayors of Hiroshima and Nagasaki read out by last year's mayor, Gwyneth Lewis; to hear readings by Richard Tamplin and Roger Baker, and to join in the community affirmation. People had studied the photo exhibition from Hiroshima and Nagasaki and enjoyed some cake and apple juice. We lit the lanterns sent from Hiroshima and carried them in procession to the river where we floated

them just as the sun was setting.

Huge thanks to our 3 canoeists, Richard Smart and Sally & Adrian Allsop, who rescued the lanterns to use again - they are so beautiful! Next year will be the 80th year since the bombings. Anne Dodd was not able to be with us in person but she had devised the words we used in our brief ceremony, and perhaps the most meaningful was this quote from the author of the classic "Hiroshima", John Hersey. He wrote, "What has kept the world safe from the bomb since 1945 has not been deterrence, in the sense of fear of specific weapons, so much as it has been memory. The memory of what happened at Hiroshima". Hopefully our small ceremony, when joined with so many others, will continue to keep that memory alive.
