

Sign the Petition - Kick Israel out of the UK's largest arms fair!

DSEI, one of the world's largest arms fairs, returns to London's ExCeL Centre between 9-12 September 2025.

DSEI is a monstrosity where the world's biggest and worst arms dealers come together to make deals in death and destruction that cause misery worldwide.

While there are so many reasons for opposing DSEI – CAAT is launching our campaign with a Kick Israel out of DSEI campaign. Israel is committing genocide in Gaza. Not only has Israel completely shattered the fragile cease-fire, the atrocities it is committing are escalating.

It is clear that if Israeli companies and Israeli delegations are allowed to exhibit at, and attend DSEI, then the government, event organisers Clarion Events, and the ExCeL Centre will all be complicit in the most horrific war crimes.
